How rewarding it has been to see both our students

and our visitors flourish in the sharing of our cultures languages. and benefits these cultural exchanges and sharing brings to us all can never really be measured, as it is held in our hearts and minds. Many years later it could also be reflected in our values, actions and



understanding of cultural diversity.

Quotes from our students in regard to the international visitors:

- "I love having them in our classroom because they teach us new things about other countries and it's real".
- "It's fun talking with them and learning how to say words in their language".
- "We get to help them learn English and they teach us Chinese".
- "We learn things about the country they live in and how lucky we are in New Zealand and HPS".
- "They don't have the same things we have and that's really interesting".
- "They get to do real Kiwi things like play on the trampoline and run in the mud".

"STRENGTH LIES IN DIFFERENCES. NOT IN SIMILARITIES"

Cultural diversity is one of eight principles in The New Zealand Curriculum that provide a foundation for schools' decision making. It calls for schools and teachers to affirm students' different cultural identities. and incorporate their cultural contexts into our teaching and learning programmes.

We are a linguistically and culturally diverse nation and students need to acquire knowledge, skills, and attitudes that equip them for life in a multi-cultural world. Teaching for cultural diversity involves helping students understand and respect diverse viewpoints, values, customs, and languages and we do this in a range of contexts in our classrooms, assemblies and cultural group opportunities.

Our international student visitors contribute greatly to this knowledge and learning.

Research shows that students learn best when their cultures and languages are recognised and reflected in school and classroom curricula. In a 2012 ERO report, it describes how the cultural diversity principle can be enacted in school and classroom curriculum. They discovered that schools and classrooms where cultural diversity was acknowledged and celebrated had better educational outcomes.

At HPS we pride ourselves on the following:

- Teachers are aware of students' different cultural identities
- Students' cultural contexts are incorporated into teaching and learning programmes and into the classroom environment
- Staff provide practical opportunities for all students to be proud and share their languages and cultures through cultural groups, special events, and school festivals that celebrate cultural difference
- All students experience learning contexts from multiple cultures
- There are clear expectations in our schools' charter for celebration of diversity, stating the right of all children to feel culturally safe
- Our bilingual identity is highly valued at HPS
- Curriculum reflects our cultural diversity and values the histories and traditions of all its people

We appreciate and acknowledge all the cultural differences that make up this amazing Helensville community. You as parents and caregivers are the children's first educators, so family and cultural perspectives set the scene for their future learning. If you have any specific skills or knowledge from a cultural perspective that you could share with us, we would welcome this as part of our learning community.


Your child will need to come to school in full uniform but will also need:


- Suitable clothing to run in, if possible a t-shirt or sweat shirt in their house colour


