I am happy to say that we try and cover every imaginable situation, and the one that tops the daily list involves you helping us make sure your child is safe.

One of the most important processes to ensure safety occurs at the start of the day is when teachers do the attendance register (roll call) and it is here that you, as parents and caregivers, play a vital role.




We need you to call the office (09 420 8005) if your child is going to be absent for part of, or the whole day and leave a message detailing the reason for the absence and if possible, an expected return to school. If you know beforehand, inform the office or your child's teacher by way of a note or email.

All unexplained absences are followed up by phone and this can take our wonderful office staff a significant amount of time. Just imagine for a minute if we had 20 children absent with no reason given, that's approximately 5 - 10 minutes per call. If you do the math, it could be close to a couple of hours before the office complete the list and then there comes the big...

"What If?"

What if the last child we called about, happily left home to walk to school but never arrived? We may well have lost two precious hours that could have been invested in finding that missing child.

Am I scaremongering? Perhaps so, however if the message I am giving you about calling the office helps to keep our children safe I think it's worth it.


Important information regarding our school drop off/pick up zone




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
